#### about 200 members

- professional astronomers (~40%), Ph.D students (~40%), Astronomers who left astronomy, retired astronomers, few amateur astronomers
- Board of 4 persons (HMS, D. Schaerer, W. Schmutz, T. Schildknecht)

#### main activities:


- get money from platform MAP / SC|NAT
- distribute travel grants (10 kE young scientists, intern. collaboration)
- Swiss contribution for Astronony & Astrophysics (6 kE)
- organize selection and support of Saas Fee course (8 kE) →
- general assembly: 1-day meeting (business meeting and science talks of new professors and Ph.D students)
- participate in outreach events (Einstein year, SC|NAT-events)


### membership fees

- 20 Euros (persons), 100-200 Euros (institutes)

### yearly Saas Fee course (since 38 years)

- Ph.D. students and professional astronomers
- 1 week (Mo-Sa) in winter: 3h lectures, skiing, 2h lectures
- 3 lecturers, pedagogical course of 8-9 lectures each
- own publication series

#### about 10 members:

- institute directors / professors (Chair: G. Meylan)
- elected by SC|NAT, proposed by SSAA-board
- observer status: SSAA, SER (M. Steinacher)

#### main activity

- "political voice" of the Swiss astronomers
- Roadmap for Astronomy in Switzerland 2007-2016
- proposes Swiss delegates for ESO committees (Council, STC and UC)
- Plans to set-up a common (Swiss) graduate course in Astrophysics
- Organizes through SC|NAT membership fees for IAU

- ``political voice'' of scientists (Astronomer, Geoscience, Physics) interested in Space Research
