Welcome to Athens

We are pleased to invite you to take part in the European Week of Astronomy and Space Science (EWASS) to be held in Athens, Greece, from 4th to 8th July, 2016. EWASS is the annual scientific conference of the European Astronomical Society (EAS) and over the years, has established itself as the largest conference for European astronomy.

Interest and opportunities to support the EWASS 2016

It is the first time that EWASS will be held in Athens. The capital of Greece, with direct flights to most European cities, is a prime location for numerous successful science conferences every year. Athens is the cradle of western civilization and forms a bridge with the newly developing countries in the southeastern Mediterranean and Western Europe. Based on the experience of previous years and the attractiveness of Athens, in terms of historic sites, affordable prices, and proximity to the popular Aegean islands, we expect meeting to gather 700 to 1000 professional astronomers from all over Europe, and other countries worldwide.

Several of the key ideas in Astronomy were developed in classical Athens 2500 years ago. The astronomical observatory of Meton, used to measure the motion of the Sun and the planets, is still visible across the Parthenon in the heart of Athens. Next to it are the historic buildings of the National Observatory of Athens, founded in 1842 as the first research center of the modern Greek state. Greece also hosts a vibrant scientific community in astrophysics and space physics, with close connections to many research institutes and high-tech companies in Europe and beyond. The host country, Greece, is a member of CERN and ESA, two of the leading European organizations in space and technology development.

• EWASS 2016 will provide Greek and European companies unparalleled access to European professional astronomy and space science, including representation at the highest level from most international organizations and collaborations in astronomy and space science (incl. ESO, ESA, SKA, ASTRONET).

Public interest in astronomy and space science is very high in Athens and in Greece in general, and we expect EWASS 2016 to lead to a huge interest from the media and general public, which sponsors and exhibitors can exploit.

The conference is also an opportunity for publishing houses, which will find an interested audience for books and journals in the field of natural sciences (mainly astrophysics, cosmology and particle physics, but also instrumentation, Earth and planetary physics, geology, chemistry and even biology).

Your support of EWASS will thus associate you to the world's leading achievements in European astronomy. We are looking forward to an exciting meeting in Athens and would be honoured by your support and sponsoring.
